

The InfoLink service of *Florida Entomologist*

Purpose of service

If there is material relevant to your *Florida Entomologist* article that is in color or is too extensive to be made part of the article's printed version, you may make it permanently available online by purchasing an "InfoLink" for \$45.

How an InfoLink works

An "InfoLink" is a hyperlink that is installed at an article's listing in the online table of contents of an issue of *Florida Entomologist* as posted on the journal's primary web server. An InfoLink *accesses a file permanently posted on the primary server.*

You must plan for your InfoLink before your article is composed by the printer. This is because articles with an InfoLink need a statement similar to this immediately after the abstract:

"Supplementary material online at <http://www.fcla.edu/FlaEnt/fe931.htm#InfoLink1>."

[The details at the end of the statement are unique for each InfoLink. The Editor will insure that the statement is correct for your InfoLink.]

This statement informs readers of your article that supplementary material is available and, in many cases, allows them to access it with a click.

Preparing the material to be posted

Most InfoLinks access a single PDF file. Whatever can be printed can be "migrated" to PDF, and PDF files migrated from different programs (e.g., spreadsheet and word-processing programs) can be combined into a single PDF file. If the software needed for these operations is not available to you or if PDF is inappropriate, you may wish to submit a file of some other type (e.g., doc, xls, ppt, avi, wav). It need not be a file type that Web browsers can display—because users can right-click on any hyperlink and download the linked file to their computer.

If you wish your InfoLink to access more than one file, you must get the agreement of the Editor and pay an additional charge of at least \$45. One of the files in a multi-file InfoLink must be a file that has hyperlinks to the other files.. This "gateway" file will be the one reached by clicking on the article's InfoLink, and Web browsers must display it so that users can easily access the other files.

When to request and how to pay

Request an InfoLink by completing the form below and submitting it as soon as possible during your dealings with the Editor. Payment for an InfoLink is due when other charges relative to your article are paid. Simply add the \$45 for an InfoLink as an item on the purchase order that pays the page charges.
